Retail is the UK's largest private sector employer and there's a wide range of jobs involved in selling goods to the public. You'll come into contact with customers in many of the roles but you could also work in areas such as buying, online retail, merchandising, IT support, marketing or distribution and logistics.

These types of jobs tend to be linked to the head offices of major retailers along with other essential roles such as HR, IT and finance.

The growing number of self-service tills in shops such as supermarkets means fewer check-out assistants, but store and deputy store managers are in demand.

The local picture

How many people are employed in retail in our area ?

Birmingham – 44,500 Bromsgrove, Redditch and Wyre Forest – 11,000 Solihull – 11,000 Southern Staffordshire – 19,000

Although the number of people working in retail is highest in Birmingham, the proportion of people working in retail is biggest in Tamworth at 15.2%, then Wyre Forest, Redditch and Cannock Chase; in Bromsgrove, at 5.3%, it's below the West Midlands average (9.6%).

Many of the big names in food retail, high street and online shopping have graduate schemes offering a wide variety of roles - some include overseas travel and company perks.

Look out for apprenticeships programmes too or search for an apprenticeship which will help you get your foot on the ladder.

Once you've secured a position with a retailer, even if you don't have the relevant qualifications, it's possible to move quite quickly up the career ladder. Companies are often looking for people to fill management positions if they can prove they have what it takes.

Some people find they have strong entrepreneurial skills and want to use them in a career. With retail you could set up an online store or pop-up shop, or even do the festival circuit if a bricks and mortar business isn't for you.
