


NCSTHECHALLENGE

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National Citizen Service (NCS) is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity that helps young people build skills for work and life, embark on new challenges, meet new people and contribute to their local community.

NCS is open to 15-17* year-olds across England and Northern Ireland.

NCS is an incredible experience where young people take part in adrenaline-fuelled activities, build confidence, gain independence and develop the skills employers value such as teamwork, decision making and leadership.

NCS also allows teenagers to connect with their local community through social action projects designed and delivered by the young people themselves. NCS graduates have already dedicated five million social action hours to their communities.

Over 275,000 teenagers have already benefited from taking part in NCS. Government backing ensures that each participant pays no more than £50 for the programme.

No one should ever be prevented from taking part in NCS for financial reasons. We believe NCS is something every young person should have the chance to do, which is why financial assistance is available. We also provide support for young people with additional needs.

Programmes are delivered by a network of quality-assured youth and community organisations. All activities are comprehensively risk-assessed and overseen by carefully selected trained instructors and mentors who all undergo enhanced DBS checks.

NCS develops practical skills for work and life.

On every programme, students will experience four phases that focus on personal and social development, including teamwork and communication skills. They will also join local businesses and social leaders to discover how they can make a difference in their community.

NCS helps job and college applications stand out and is recommended by UCAS.

UCAS recommends students include NCS in their personal statement. NCS gives a positive framework to showcase their skills for their applications and during interviews.

NCS complements other youth and volunteering programmes.

NCS works alongside youth and voluntary programmes such as the Duke of Edinburgh's Award. NCS encourages social mixing and regular guided reflection, making it a truly unique experience.

The Challenge

The Challenge is the local provider in London, Surrey, Buckinghamshire, Berkshire, West Midlands, Greater Manchester and parts of Lancashire and parts of Yorkshire. We have successfully been delivering the programme since an initial pilot in 2009.

NCS programme in your area:

Young people can take part in NCS during the Autumn or there's a choice of several start dates during the summer holidaus.

Part 1 - Get Active

Staying away from home in the countryside taking part in outdoor activities.

Part 2 - Get Involved

Young people work together to learn a new skill in sport, media, photography, music, drama, enterprise or art.

Part 3 - Make Your Mark

Young people will design a social action project to make a difference in their local community and then pitch for funding for it. They then use this funding to bring their project to life.
